The UNRBA has now collected Routine Monitoring samples for 51 months. Routine Monitoring sample collection for the Modeling Program is COMPLETE.

Routine Monitoring - Completeness

- When results from September and October are added to the database (due next week), it will contain some 28,200 data points
- That represents almost 95% of the targeted total
- The large majority of "missing" data is the result of dry stream conditions or severe weather conditions that precluded sample collection

High Flow Events

- Two tropical weather events (Florence and Michael) allowed for collection of high flow samples early this fall
- "Big Five" lake tributaries sampled
- High Flow sample collection is **complete**.
