UNRBA Decision Framework Development

Review "Starred" Questions from November PFC Meeting

- How do external stakeholders those without formal standing within the UNRBA contribute or factor into the decision-making process?
- Are majority and minority reports an appropriate option when consensus cannot be reached but the timeline for decision making demands a next step?
- As a representative or director, do you have what you need to update your colleagues and your home jurisdiction or utility about UNRBA developments and upcoming decisions?
- Beyond clarifying that Table 1 is an example and decision pathways are flexible, do you have specific edits we can address?
- Is the Double Triangle tool appropriate as decision guidance more broadly than MSRW?
- When the Board delegates decision authority to a special committee like the PFC, is one vote per jurisdiction an appropriate alternative if consensus can't be reached?

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Status of the Interim Alternative Implementation Approach – Program Description

Status of the Interim Alternative Implementation Approach (IAIA)

- The IAIA Workgroup discussed components of a draft Program Description for Stage I Existing Development IAIA during their meeting on November 5th
- A draft Program Description was distributed to the IAIA Workgroup on November 13th
- Comments provided by the IAIA Workgroup participants have been incorporated into a revised draft that will be discussed following the PFC meeting (December 3rd)
- A revised draft for review by the PFC is anticipated to be distributed by December 11th
- Written comments on the draft Program Description will be requested from the PFC by December 18th
- Revisions will be incorporated for distribution of a draft to the PFC and the Board on January 8th for consideration during the January 15th Board meeting

Approach to the Development of the Program Description Discussed at November IAIA Workgroup Meeting

- The IAIA Workgroup meetings have included UNRBA members and staff from NGO's and DWR
- The Workgroup acknowledged the overall goals of the IAIA and its use as a pilot for a future revised strategy
- Initial program components would be designed to promote flexibility
- Progress would be evaluated to ensure that the overall goals of the program are being met
- Components would be revised as needed

The IAIA Workgroup discussion on November 5, 2019 was used to develop the preliminary draft of the program components. This draft was distributed to the Workgroup for review on November 13, 2019.

Overview of Comments From the Workgroup on the Program Description

- Need for DWR to explicitly allow for the IAIA to serve as compliance with the Stage I Existing Development Rules
- Clarification of three potential pathways for implementation of the IAIA
 - Joint compliance under the Rules with an agreement among participants to participate in the IAIA
 - Individual compliance under the Rules if DWR incorporates the IAIA into the Model Program
 - Legislation to allow for the IAIA to serve as compliance
- Balancing flexibility in program implementation with risks and uncertainties
- Ensuring that local prioritization of projects results in equitable contributions
- Counting investments in programmatic measures above and beyond what was in place at baseline (2006)

Overview of Comments on the Program Description, Continued

- Appropriateness of funding structure
 - Use of the existing UNRBA fee structure was approved by consensus by the IAIA Workgroup on October 8, 2019
- Overall level of funding
 - Is it appropriate? Is it fixed?
 - When does it transition from "example" to proposal?
- Why is implementation start date anticipated in FY2022?
- What is the process for obtaining local approval of the IAIA?
- Need to set up a separate non-profit if UNRBA members contribute to a pool of funds
- Review by DWR for activities that are not on the eligible list
 - What would be the process?
 - Who would conduct this review?

Modeling and Regulatory Support Status

MRS Status

- Modelers are continuing to coordinate with UNC Collaboratory researchers on site selection for the onsite wastewater treatment system study
- A conference call with the modeling team, DWR, and the Collaboratory was held on November 22nd to discuss potential grant money that may be available to further evaluation of onsite wastewater treatment system loading
- Modelers are continuing with hydrologic calibration for the baseline period
- MRSW meeting planned for December has been shifted to IAIA Workgroup meeting
- The next MRSW meeting is planned for January 7, 2020 from 9:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. to be followed by the January PFC meeting


Potential Impact of the Upcoming 303(d) Evaluation of Falls Lake


Potential Impact of the Upcoming 303(d) Evaluation of Falls Lake

- DWR 2020 list and the Integrated Report covers data from 2014 through 2018.
- EMC new methodology for 2020 303(d) impaired waters approved November 14, 2019.
- Draft 2020 list anticipated for public review (60 days) approximately March or April 2020.
- 303(d) report presented to EMC about July 2020 as an informational item or an action item.
- State to submit 303(d) list to EPA likely August 1, 2020.
- Important process for UNRBA because the list of impaired waters ultimately determines the success of our management efforts based on the current Falls Lake Rules.

Potential Impact of the Upcoming 303(d) Evaluation of Falls Lake

- Predictive analysis of 2020 303(d) of Falls Lake chlorophyll-a data from 2014-2018 was developed.
 29 locations from DWR_NCSULCAAE, and City of Durham
 - 29 locations from DWR, NCSU CAAE, and City of Durham
- Recall UNRBA 2019 monitoring report identified elevated chlorophyll-a levels in 2017 and 2018.
- Predicted 2020 303(d) analyses indicates potential for expanded impairment determination for Falls
- It is important for the UNRBA to continue to weigh-in on this process and to continue its effort to press for a more scientifically valid approach to both the standard and how the lake segments are set and assessed.
